2020 VIRTUAL PRAYER VIGIL RESOURCES

Preparations for Prayer:

Find a comfortable spot to pray for an hour. Set up the space so that you are comfortable and undisturbed. Light a candle, find your Bible, play soft music without lyrics, print out this page along with the prayer list from the announcement attachment to the Tuesday email from trinityperkasie@verizon.net.

Check in on Trinity's facebook page vigil post to let us know that you are entering a time of prayer and ask for prayer requests by your post. (www.facebook.com/TrinityPerkasie) Decide how often you will check for responses over your appointed hour.

Center yourself for prayer with a few deep breaths, close your eyes if you are comfortable doing so. Find your style of prayer for the next hour.

Suggestions:

- Read one of the Bible passages, below, or a passage you choose. Read it slowly and read a few times. Pause to ponder and follow where your mind dwells on a certain word or phrase. Wonder, "What is God saying to me?"
- Pray through the Morning Prayer intercessions, below, allowing for pauses at the (...) mark and adding your own thanksgivings and concerns.
- Allow for silence and listening with no active speaking or reading on your part. Listen and expect God's presence in the silence.
- Pray through the prayer lists, naming each person by name and calling to mind healing and hope in Jesus Christ. Add those for whom you pray.
- Use the prayers listed, below, to pray for healing, healthcare workers, anxiety, the unemployed and more. Read the prayers silently or out loud. Read slowly.
- Use your own prayer practice: sing a hymn, repeat a Taize song over and over, practice meditative breathing techniques, color or doodle, or do whatever works best for you. (Share your practice on facebook for others we can all learn from one another!)

Lord Christ, you came into the world as one of us, and suffered as we do. As we go through the trials of life, help us to realize that you are with us at all times and in all things; that we have no secrets from you; and that your loving grace enfolds us for eternity. In the security of your embrace we pray.

God our comforter, you are a refuge and a strength for us, a helper close at hand in times of distress. Enable us so to hear the words of faith that our fear is dispelled, our loneliness eased, our anxiety calmed, and our hope reawakened. May your Holy Spirit lift us above our sorrow to the peace and light of your constant love; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

O Lord our God, you see and know and feel the pain of the world. Look upon us when we feel alone, and enfold us with your love, that in the midst of pain we may know your presence; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

Amen.

God of justice, we remember before you those who suffer want and anxiety from lack of work. Guide the people of this land so to use our wealth and resources that all people may find suitable and fulfilling employment and receive just payment for their labor; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Compassionate God, support and strengthen all those who reach out in love, concern, and prayer for the sick and distressed. In their acts of compassion, may they know that they are your instruments. In their concerns and fears, may they know your peace. In their faithful serving, may they know your steadfast love. May they not grow weary or faint-hearted, for your mercy's sake.

Amen.

Merciful God, your healing power is everywhere about us. Strengthen those who work among the sick; give them courage and confidence in all they do. Encourage them when they are overwhelmed with many pressing needs or when their efforts seem futile. Increase their trust in your power to bring life and wholeness even in the midst of death and pain and crying. May they be thankful for every sign of health you give, and humble before the mystery of your healing grace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

God of earth and air, water and fire, height and depth, we pray for those who work in danger, who rush in to bring hope and help and comfort when others flee to safety, whose mission is to seek and save, serve and protect, and whose presence embodies the protection of the Good Shepherd. Give them caution and concern for one another, so that in safety they may do what must be done, under your watchful eye. Support them in their courage and dedication that they may continue to save lives, ease pain, and mend the torn fabric of lives and social order; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
